## Tidewater Inc.Wins the 2004 NOIA Safety in Seas Award

WASHINGTON, March 29 — Tidewater Inc., (TDW) was awarded the 2004 National Ocean Industries Association (NOIA) Safety in Seas Award, recognizing their outstanding contribution to the improvement of safe operating procedures in the ocean industries. Tidewater's award-winning nomination was selected by a blue-ribbon panel of judges from the U.S. Coast Guard, the Minerals Management Service and the National Academies' Marine Board. The judges awarded Tidewater the prestigious honor in recognition of the company's dramatic overall improvement of the corporate safety culture and uniform implementation of stringent safety standards in its operations throughout the world.

Acknowledging the significant contributions made by modern-day pioneers in their pursuit of the ocean frontier, Compass Publications, Inc., publishers of Sea Technology magazine, established the NOIA Safety in Seas Award in 1978. The award recognizes excellence among those who, by their actions, design or influence, have contributed to improving the safety of life offshore.
