2 TO THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES, TO THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTA-

3 TIVES OF THE UNITED STATES IN CONGRESS ASSEMBLED, TO THE CONGRESSIONAL

4 DELEGATION REPRESENTING THE STATE OF IDAHO IN THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED

5 STATES, AND TO THE UNITED STATES SECRETARIES OF THE INTERIOR AND OF

6 ENERGY.

7 We, your Memorialists, the House of Representatives and the Senate of the Idaho assembled in the Second Regular Session of State of 8 the Fifty-eighth Idaho Legislature, do hereby respectfully represent that: 9 WHEREAS, policies of the federal government have placed 10 much of the Outer Continental Shelf off-limits to oil and natural gas 11 production; and WHEREAS, development of oil and natural gas resources, 12 where allowed off our shore, has coexisted for decades with recreational and 13 commercial activi-14 ties while benefitting the entire nation; and 15 WHEREAS, America's increased dependence on foreign energy supplies and global competition for oil and natural gas will create a 16 threat to our national security; and 17 18 WHEREAS, since 2000, natural gas and oil prices have more than doubled; 19 and 20 WHEREAS, rising energy costs are taking a toll on poor families throughout the nation and, in a recent annual survey by the National 21 Energy Assistance Directors' Association, 32% of families had to sacrifice 2.2 medical care, 24% 23 failed to make their rent or mortgage payment, 20% were without food for at 24 least a day, and 44% skipped paying or paid less than their home energy bill 25 in the past year; and 26 WHEREAS, the nation's farming and ranching sectors depend reliable on a 27 and affordable supply of energy to run equipment, fertilize crops, and transport products to market; and 28 29 WHEREAS, the Economic Research Service of the United States Department of 30 Agriculture estimates that farmers' fuel expenses for 2005

exceeded their 2004 fuel expenses by 37%, and higher energy prices mean increased 31 costs to farmers and ranchers, who already face tremendous economic challenges; 32 and 33 WHEREAS, in spite of significant progress in energy efficiency, the United States will still need 32% more energy to support economic 34 growth by 2025; and inland states throughout the west are doing 35 WHEREAS, more to increase domestic energy production, and the public lands that 36 lie off our nation's coasts also hold enormous potential for energy production, 37 which could significantly help to meet the energy needs of all Americans. 38 39 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the members of the Second Regular Session of the Fifty-eighth Idaho Legislature, the House of 40 Representatives and the Senate concurring therein, that we encourage the 41 President of the United States of America, the Honorable George W. Bush, to 42 revoke administrative withdrawals on offshore energy development on the nation's 43 Outer Continental 44 Shelf and direct the Minerals Management Service to contract for test wells to 2 1 be drilled in order to provide needed energy resources to the United States in an environmentally responsible manner. 2 3 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that we encourage the Congress of the United States of America to make the nation's Outer Continental 4 Shelf available for energy development in an environmentally responsible manner. 5 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chief Clerk of the House
